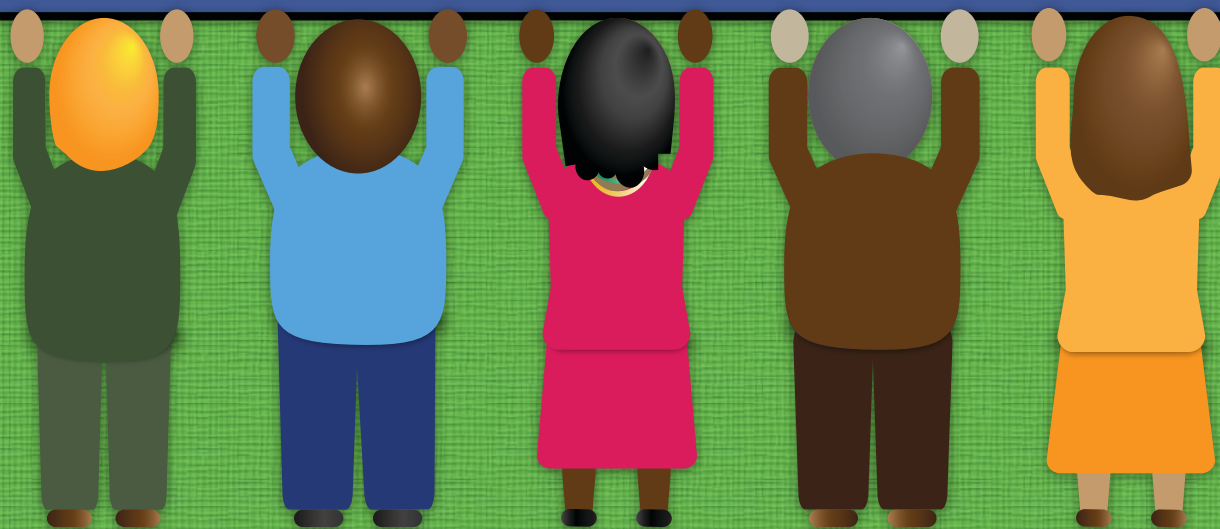

In 2014 our churches set a record for the greatest yearly increase in both dollars and percentage since we came into existence some 30 years ago.

**T**oday my heart is filled with gratitude and admiration for the CNBC churches who have given through our Cooperative Giving program. In 2014 our churches set a record for the greatest yearly increase in both dollars and percentage since we came into existence some 30 years ago.

Our Cooperative Giving increased by more than \$110,000 in 2014 over 2013 giving, an increase of more than 16.5 percent. When I share this great news with my colleagues in other SBC conventions, they are astounded at the rate of growth of our Cooperative Giving strategy.

I am fully aware that when churches contribute through our Cooperative Giving program they are choosing to sacrifice something that would undoubtedly be vital to their ministries. Their commitment to our world missions strategy is evidence they have chosen to give themselves away to advance the Kingdom of God. In many cases, pastors and church leaders take lesser salaries in order to give so more churches can be planted and more missionaries can be sent.

More and more churches are giving through our Cooperative Giving program. We have seen

increases in every region in Canada. The 16.5 percent increase in 2014 is preceded by two years of significant growth in 2013 and 2012, which makes the 2014 increase all the more remarkable.

Our Cooperative Giving is the back bone of CNBC ministries. It undergirds everything and enables us to fund international missionaries, church planters, retreats for pastors and wives, evangelism training, special events, strengthening churches ministries, and countless resourcing events that help our churches advance the Kingdom of God.

The stewardship of these funds invested in the Kingdom of God through our Cooperative Giving strategy weighs heavy on myself and our CNBC staff. We are making every effort to make sure that every dollar is spent in the most effective way possible to impact the Kingdom of God. We are in the process of evaluating all our current operations and expenditures and seeking to determine more efficient ways to serve our Lord and His churches.

We look forward to the future as we seek to serve in the most effective and efficient ways. We also thank you for your partnership in advancing the Kingdom of God.

# February 2015 *Horizon* last printed edition

The CNBC *Horizon* is our primary method of communication and has helped us connect our churches from Vancouver Island to Cape Breton Island. People have read stories of what God has done in churches across Canada and have been inspired and encouraged to continue to persevere and serve God where He has placed them.

The *Horizon* has helped us become and stay connected as a family committed to the Great Commandment and the Great Commission.

This February issue is the last *Horizon* that will be printed in our CNBC office and the last one to be mailed by Canada Post to our churches. The subsequent *Horizon* magazines will be sent to individuals and churches by electronic means and can be printed by anyone who has a computer.

Because of the staff time saved by not having to print, count and mail, we will be able to publish six times a year instead of the current four times a year. This change in the distribution method (digital) means we will save more than \$35,000 a year in printing, mailing, personnel, and equipment costs.

Digitally publishing the CNBC *Horizon* will also enable us to take full advantage of the new media features that electronic formatting affords. Readers will be able to link directly to web pages with a simple click. Video and audio media will be embedded directly in the electronic format of the CNBC *Horizon*.

Because distribution costs are next to nil, we will be increasing our free subscription base and widening our audience. Our hope is to increase the participation of a younger audience who are the future of the CNBC.

Another advantage of the electronic format is the ability to access the CNBC *Horizon* on any digital device either stationary or mobile, and thus increase access flexibility for our readers. The current digital *Horizon* and previous issues can be viewed at [cnbcnow.ca](http://cnbcnow.ca).

With all these advantages, our readers will still have the capability of printing any *Horizon* for themselves or for someone else who prefers the written version.

# Mississippi couple prepares BC city for a new church plant

WHITE ROCK, BC – When Earl and Meridith Grisaffe moved last July to White Rock, a small Lower Mainland city just minutes away from the US border, they were under no illusions that it would be easy building relationships with local residents, especially when the conversation turned to why they had come there.

Earl recalls one encounter with a photographer who was shooting from the pier. “We talked for about 15 to 20 minutes. And once he found out that I was up here doing mission work, he took his tripod, folded it up, took his camera off of that—and left,” he says. “In the first three months, that happened a lot. They just turn around and leave.”

The Grisaffes were sent by their home church, Morrison Heights Baptist Church in Clinton, Mississippi, and NAMB’s Send North America-Vancouver to White Rock to prepare the community and gather the first people for a future CNBC church plant.

Tim Rowan, Morrison Heights’ associate pastor of missions, says White Rock first came to their attention about four years ago when their missions committee visited Vancouver to discern where God might be calling them to sponsor a church plant.

“In one meeting I went to in Vancouver,” Rowan says, “a leader said there had been an individual that had been praying for 20 years for somebody to come and plant a church in White Rock—and nobody had ever done that. I think that fact attracted us.”

Rowan adds their other motivation was the fact that “there had never been a Southern Baptist church located in that particular area.”

The Grisaffes, who directed their church’s singles ministry, had been on several mission trips to Metro Vancouver since 2006. Last year they sensed God calling them to actually live in White Rock for a few years.

Most days now are spent out in the community seeking to make new friends as well as serving in various volunteer capacities.

In particular they try to find people who would be open to hearing the gospel or attending a Bible study. “We always pray,” Meridith says, “that God does not let us bypass somebody that He has put right there in front of us. But sometimes He surprises us.”

One surprise was being asked by a small Chinese church to meet with their youth on Sunday afternoons. “They had nobody to teach them the Bible,” she says. “A lot of them are Christians but some aren’t. We didn’t expect that at all.”

Rowan says the Mississippi congregation stays in close touch with the Grisaffes. “Several Sunday School life groups have adopted them and contact them on a regular basis. And we Skype with them in our worship service a couple of times a year.” As well, the church has five mission trips to White Rock planned for 2015.

Ray Woodard, the city coordinator for Send North America-Vancouver, says the Grisaffes are “the new entrepreneurs of the church planting venture. Theirs is the task of engaging a new community with the gospel in order to see a new outpost on the horizon.”

“I really believe,” Earl says, “that a lot of the new missionaries are going to be people like me and Meridith. You don’t have to be a pastor or whatever. You just come off the pew and start helping people start a church.”

# Kingdom Seeds

## Missional Church Planting

In a world filled with broken people living in broken relationships, starting new faith communities, telling the Good News and gathering seekers and believers into congregations, is a demonstration of both the Great Command and the Great Commission.

When God said, "Let us make man in our image," He also said, "It is not good that man should be alone." In other words, we cannot be living images of the Three-In-One outside of healthy relationships with one another. Yet, when we look around us, we quickly see that we live in a world of brokenness. Broken trust, broken friendships and broken families litter the landscape, and the shattered casualties are all too often left behind, without hope or help. It is against this backdrop of brokenness that the church is called to join God in his reconciling, restorative, redeeming ministry to the world he created.

This is the driving principle for all of us in the church, participating together in the *missio Dei*, the mission of God. It is the cornerstone of church planting in the Canadian National Baptist Convention.

One of the best examples of what is called missional church planting in Atlantic Canada is Community Bible Chapel in Timberlea, Nova Scotia. Located just 15 minutes west of downtown Halifax, Timberlea is a community of relative affluence, having the highest family income of any neighbourhood we have surveyed in the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM).

It was just one year ago that I met with six men one evening and we began to talk about starting a new faith community there: a body of believers who would make disciples and multiply

themselves into other new churches. The group has no pastor with formal education. They have no hot worship band—though they are developing a worship team from within. They started with a few men and women who were seasoned Christians—half of them were retired—and had a huge heart for God and people.

So how have they been doing? I am so glad you asked. On May 31 last year, just six weeks after their first service, they hosted a community BBQ and Block Party. More than 300 attended.

On September 20 they had a Corn Boil and movie night and used that event to reach out to more people from the community. That same month they seized the opportunity to get involved with a women's shelter located just seven driveways from their facility. Those women began attending their Sunday services and 23 attended a Christmas lunch hosted by the ladies in this now growing church.

On Christmas Eve 72 people attended a community worship service, and on the second Sunday of January more than 60 were in attendance.

How did all this happen? A few people—none formally-trained ministers—met together for nearly six months asking God how they might join Him in His work to the communities around them. Their commitment was to do whatever God told them, regardless of the sacrifice.

With no external funding, this once tiny group of Christ followers is experiencing the blessings of God, and are already participating in multiplying themselves through participation in Cooperative Giving and local church planting activity. May such Kingdom seeds only increase!

# Missional living takes creative approach

TORONTO—No one saw this coming: 74 people, from six different people groups, all giving their lives to Jesus during Rendezvous Toronto's summer evangelism blitz. As incredible as this sounds, Rendezvous is still praying for a miracle as their two year old urban church plant tries to figure out how to congregated the evangelized into missional communities throughout the city.

The majority of those who committed to Jesus are children and students from Muslim, Hindu and Buddhist upbringings. Their parents can rarely speak English and won't allow them to attend church.

Rendezvous had three Tibetan students pray to receive Christ. "This is significant because it is reported there are only 100 Tibetan Christians worldwide" explains Lead Pastor Scott Rourk. "Two of the three are siblings, who called our church to request another Bible after their mother forbid them from reading the Bible they received at camp and proceeded to throw it away because they are Buddhists." Answers to questions like this are not black or white; these are some of the challenges facing Rendezvous' engagement with the lost cultures of Canada.

Scott has been in Toronto for five and a half years. He has already planted one church where he baptized nine new believers in just three-and-a-half years. That church now has a new pastor since Scott left two years ago to plant Rendezvous Church full time.

Rendezvous is a network of urban missional communities seeking to transform the city through community engagement by planting 10 churches in 10 years. With three of those locations underway and two more starting in 2016, Rendezvous is well on its way to realizing its vision of being a city wide church plant.

Scott believes that together we can build a great city for all people by drawing Toronto near to God through faith in Jesus Christ, boldly professing our hope in Him and spurring one another to love and action.

He says, "We focus on intimate weekly home gatherings where members not only share meals together but share all aspects of life together.

We meet people where they are and encourage our members to be involved in each other's lives on a daily basis. We believe gospel discipleship is relational and must be lived intimately in real fellowship and intentionally missional in our community."

Living missional to reach people in a city as diverse as Toronto is not easy. It takes creative approaches. One way Rendezvous engages culture is

by preparing a monthly meal and Bible discussion at a home for new immigrants and refugees.

The church helps run two soccer leagues and day camps for the under privileged, engaging families with the gospel through sports. Rendezvous has even created its own camp called SparkGood which has been accepted in four public schools. It helps students learn to take risks that make the world a better place.

Being missional has also translated into large citywide gatherings like free bike repair clinics endorsed by their city councilman and held in city venues like Yonge Dundas Square and High Park.

This approach is working for Rendezvous. Scott explains, "I have been invited into my kids' public school three times to share about the true meaning of Christmas and Easter. This is a direct result of our intentional involvement in our community with the gospel of Christ."

Flexible programming allows your church to make the most of your space and the gifting of your volunteers. Participants will discover Jesus in a fun, life-changing way.

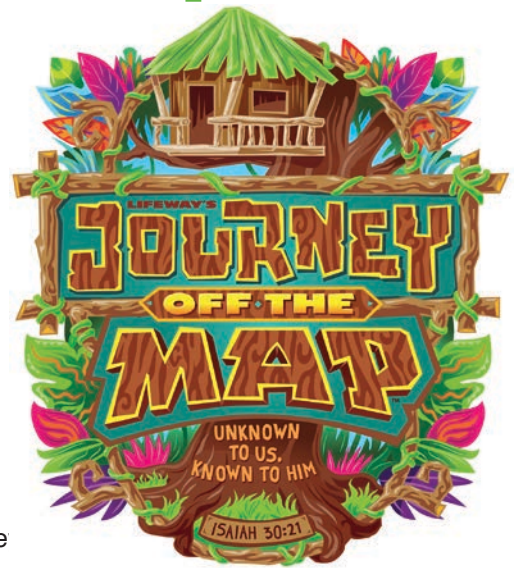

**Ottawa is often before us.** It's presence is perceptible as daily press releases from parliament hill nestle into our news feed. It is notable as the Senators and RedBlacks take their place in our national sports narrative. And it is shockingly obvious when breaking news reveals an unfolding national tragedy, like what happened this past fall.

But the Lord is doing more in our nation's capital than we will ever perceive in popular media. And I would encourage us to pray with our sister churches as they seek to be used by God to impact this influential city.

It has been exciting this last year to gather every few months with CNBC pastors and leaders in the area to pray for Ottawa and the neighbouring National Capital Region city of Gatineau, Quebec. We have been praying that the Lord would bless all of the evangelical churches in the city, would strengthen our existing churches, and would guide us as we seek to start new CNBC churches in both cities.

All six churches who gathered together about a year ago have sensed the Lord leading them to each start one or more new churches over the next many years. We have placed those dots on a map and are

praying specifically for the Lord to lead in timing, resources, and strategy.

- 20% of Ottawa was born outside Canada. Top 3 countries of origin: United Kingdom, China, and Lebanon

Also, since we began meeting to pray a year ago, the Lord has brought two young church plants officially into our CNBC family. Restoration Church is serving the African population in Ottawa and Bellevue Salem Baptist Church is serving the Haitian population in Gatineau.

God is answering our prayers and we are beginning to see the first fruits. But we know that there is an even greater harvest yet to come!

**Ottawa is often before us.** Let us also let it into our hearts and be the focus of our prayers.





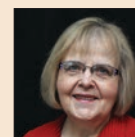

## Happy New Year!

As the New Year begins the ground here in Cochrane is covered in pure white snow. Like this blanket of snow, we on the Finance Team look to a new budget year where the pages are clean and white! It is like a fresh start—we resolve to do a better job of tracking our finances, a better job of reporting the financial picture, less corrections and adjustments and so the story goes! Many of our churches and church plants are faced with the same “new start” and we wish for them a great year as God blesses with people and resources in 2015.

As we look back over 2014 we recognize that God continues to bless the convention. In accounting we begin the process of clearing the books, reporting final totals for 2014, preparing official donation receipts and preparing for our annual audit. Church treasurers will be working on the same sort of things. Some of the things the church treasurer will want to do at year end will include:

- Preparing official donation receipts for contributors and balancing these receipts to the income line item (receipts must be issued to donors no later than February 28)

- Preparing T4's for employees and reconciling CRA remittances (deadline is February 28)
- Reconciling accounts receivable and accounts payable – preparing a listing of any outstanding items that will be carried forward to the current year
- Reconciling GST/HST paid in 2014 and applying to CRA for rebate
- Preparing year end financial reports

As you look forward to 2015, your church treasurer will set up the books for the year, input budget figures, set up new payroll files, track giving and prepare reports for the congregation. The treasurer or finance team will also begin work on the Annual Report for Canada Revenue Agency which is due six months after the fiscal year end. This report summarizes activities of your church as a charitable organization.

## Are You a Registered Charity?

Perhaps 2015 is the year your church will apply for registered charity status! Although a bit of a process, it is well worth it for your church to be registered and consequently be able to handle your own contributions, expenses, payroll and so on. A number of our churches have gone through the incorporation process but that does not mean that they have registered charitable status. To be a registered charity in Canada, the church must apply through Canada Revenue Agency using form T2050 which is available on the CRA web site, [cra-arc.gc.ca](http://cra-arc.gc.ca).

This past year I have talked with some churches that applied for registered status. A number of them applied and received a letter back from Canada Revenue Agency with some questions to confirm, explain or ask for additional information. In most of these cases, a response to CRA's questions resulted in the church being granted charitable status.

As I looked over the documents it seemed that often in the applications the churches were not clear that their purpose is to advance religion and that specifically they will do this through worship, Bible study, prayer, discipleship and evangelism. The activity and objectives listed should all point back to the purpose. The convention has sample information available on our website, [cnbc.ca](http://cnbc.ca), to help you as you prepare to apply for charitable status.

We also have samples of church constitutions and bylaws that might be helpful. *One point to remember is that your constitution must have a dissolution clause.* This clause must clearly indicate what would happen with the church assets should the church close. Such assets must go to another charitable organization upon dissolution.

I said, “Our militia headquarters is receiving the president of the republic as he will present an important speech today. We should be there, but we promised you to come here. If you didn’t meet us at that circle, we would have attended it.” We spent the evening together rejoicing in the important decision my three friends just made.

The next day, I learned that my friends didn’t return back home right away, but spent the night driving, meditating and thanking the Lord for what He had done in their lives. Late that night, as they arrived home, people on their

street screamed: they thought that my friends were killed in the explosion which occurred in the militia headquarters killing the president of the republic and many of his bodyguards and attendees. Two of my friends were from the same group of guards. Instead of attending that militia meeting, they were with me in the evangelistic centre giving their lives to Christ!

Who would have imagined my friends would go to meet Jesus instead of attending that meeting in the presence of the president who was assassinated with many of his followers! Death had not an appointment with my friends, but eternal salvation! Today, my three friends are true believers, followers of Christ the Saviour.





## Family experiences missions overseas

**P**astor Shane Spannagel of Richmond Hill Baptist in Calgary, and his family of six, wife Marisa, daughter Ellen (17), and sons Caleb (14), Samuel (11), and Jared (9) took an international mission trip in the summer of 2014. Here they share their experience:

We come from an extended family with a legacy of international missions but as a family we had only done a few mission trips together here in Canada. We support missions, pray for missionaries, love our family members who are missionaries but we had not had the time, finances or energy to take our own family overseas. It was a dream of ours but we were not quite sure how to make it a reality.

In May, we received a call from one of our family members who serves with the International Mission Board and she said that they were moving and if we wanted to come and visit them in the Middle East it had to be the summer of 2014. It turned our whole summer upside down! We had not planned nor budgeted for a big trip for our family of six!

We hesitated applying for the “Ministers Experiencing Missions” Grant from the Canadians On Mission Offering (CMO) because we were planning everything so quickly. The CNBC responded quickly and beautifully and we told our prayer partners that it was a miracle gift to our family. With the help from the minister’s grant and student grants for our older children, we felt like it was God saying that we should go and experience this trip as a family.

This family mission trip offered us a practical way to help our children to become mission minded. We spent time with Syrian refugees, encouraged missionaries, prayer walked, visited Biblical sites and were refreshed as we took a break from our lives and ministries here in Calgary. We learned new ways to pray for the people in the Middle East and about history and religions so that we can be more thoughtful and mindful on how to support missions around the world. It gave all of us an attitude adjustment and a fresh perspective on how God has blessed us and how He is working around the world.

We know that our God is big and He cares about the nations. Going away from home took us away from the sameness of ministry in one community and experience how other Christians worship and serve. Our older children processed the implications of different faiths in a new way which helps them as they relate to kids in their schools from different faith backgrounds. Having multi-sensory experiences in the Middle East changed us as a family.

Canadian parents are intentional about many aspects of our children’s lives such as arts, athletics and education. Going on a family mission trip strengthened our family’s spiritual legacy by taking a focused time to serve together out of our comfort zone where we can really learn and grow.

Thank you to our CNBC family in making this dream a reality for us. We also challenge other families and encourage you to make that gift to your family of a family mission trip.



# NAMB missionaries: finding 'persons of peace'

EDMONTON, AB—With the rapid growth in both Calgary and Edmonton, construction of high rise buildings, townhouses, and apartments are also on the rise. 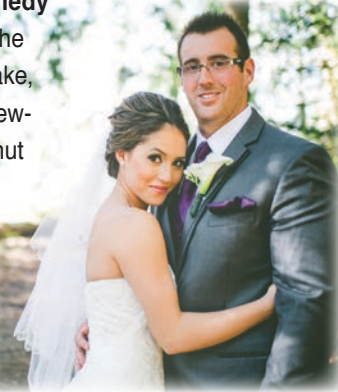

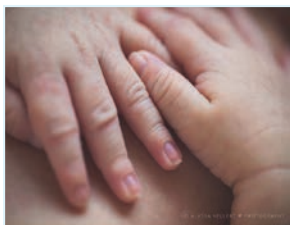
