Cooperative Program: largest amount ever given



Thank you! Thank you to the churches of the CNBC who sacrificed and generously gave to the Cooperative Program in the year 2016. You have set a record for the largest amount ever given to the Cooperative Program in the history of the CNBC. The increase in 2016 over 2015 was more than \$75,000 dollars which is an increase of more than 10 percent.

I am very aware, as I have talked with pastors and leaders in our CNBC churches, that giving to the Cooperative Program is not something that comes from the surplus funds that our churches enjoy. I realize that giving to the Cooperative Program is a choice to invest in missions and the Kingdom of God while forgoing very real and valid needs in our churches. This choice is evidence of the commitment our churches have, to being missional and concerned with a world that needs our Saviour.

The Cooperative Program is the main funding mechanism for all the ministries and missions of the CNBC. It is our way of funding international missionaries and enabling them to fulfill their missionary assignments without ever having to go from church to church to raise their missionary salaries. Their salaries are secure and assured on the day they begin their missionary assignment, giving them the opportunity to focus all their energy and effort into their mission without having to worry about raising any funds for their salaries.

The Cooperative Program is the way we fund ministry personnel who are available to any of our churches free of any financial obligation from the church they are helping.

Ministry consultants help churches in the areas of evangelism, church planting, church strengthening, discipleship, women's and men's ministry, missions and church health, always free of any charge.

The Cooperative Program enables the CNBC to organize and put on training and equipping events for churches and their leaders at little or, more often, no cost to the participants being trained. Pastors and wives of pastors are invited to Oasis weekend retreats that are heavily subsidized by the Cooperative Program in order to provide a time of much-needed refreshment and rest.

The Cooperative Program also provides funds for our seminary and college to help train new pastors and leaders for the work of the ministry. It enables us to invest in ministries in our regional associations across Canada.

How does all this happen: Churches give a percentage of their general offerings (10 percent suggested) either monthly or quarterly through the Cooperative Program and these funds are utilized to fund every aspect of the CNBC and its ministries and missions. Because we give to the Cooperative Program we can partner with our sister denomination the Southern Baptist Convention. They have chosen to take a generous portion of their Cooperative Program funds to partner with the CNBC to plant churches all over Canada and help us reach Canada for Christ.

For us in the CNBC, the Cooperative Program is all about investing in people, ministries and missions. The last word is the same as the first: Thank you!

Businessman becomes Nova Scotia church planter, seminary student

CAPE BRETON ISLAND, NS—It's a five-day drive from the church he's planting in the Maritimes to classes at the Canadian Southern Baptist Seminary in Cochrane, Alberta, but that doesn't concern second-term student and former businessman Mark Palmer. He takes most of his courses online.

Palmer, who already holds a master's degree in business from the Richard Ivey School of Business at the University of Western Ontario, spent 26 years in management in manufacturing plants. He and his family—wife Janet and six children, two still at home—always had been active in their Plymouth Brethren church—“Sometimes I was serious about the Lord”—but it wasn't until 2006, when he attended the Sudbury youth conference with his teenagers, that being a Christ-follower became important to him.

“As the speaker [J.B. Nicholson] was talking about the value of Christ and how worthy He is to be served ... I realized instead of focusing on the Lord I'd focused on my career,” Palmer said. “It was a powerful moment. I said, ‘Lord, You've reached me but I'm not in a position to do anything; I'm in a box and can't get out.’ The debt I was carrying would take 20 years to clear. ‘If you take care of the debt I will give up everything to serve you,’ I told Him.”

A chain of events led to freedom from debt and his current role as church planter of Inverness Community Church on Cape Breton, and student at the Canadian Southern Baptist Seminary.

“The Lord knew I meant business,” Palmer said. He and his wife sold their much-loved, 55-acre “hobby farm,” divested themselves of many of the “big boy toys” they had

acquired, and received an unexpected \$42,000 tax benefit from the government that together cleared their debt.

“Life was awesome in 2011,” Palmer said. “God had changed everything in our life.”

By that time he was a well-paid operations manager at a Quaker Oats manufacturing plant in Ontario, the family was living in a big, beautiful home in Peterborough, Ontario, and he was an occasional supply preacher as well as elder in his local church.

“I had forgotten about the promise I made Him,” Palmer said. “But something was different. I used to be so driven. I was the guy available 24/7 and would even skip an anniversary dinner with my wife if something came up at work, but now I had no interest in business.”

Then, in 2012, as part of a corporate financial move, Palmer became one of 3,700 managers let go on one day. A generous exit offer made life easy for the next year.

“Now I'm starting to think really seriously,” Palmer said. “Could He call me into full-time ministry?”

A chain of people coming into his life, and a test from God, led in 2015 to Palmer becoming a Canadian National Baptist Convention church planter of Inverness Community Church on Cape Breton Island.

Palmer and his son Kyle had gone to North Carolina in 2012 to help in a short-term evangelistic thrust with J.B. Nicholson (the same preacher whom the Lord used to reach Mark in Sudbury back in 2006) and the Good News on the Move team. There he met Grant and his wife Shelley Canfield, directors of Emmanuel Bible Camp on Prince

Edward Island. They knew Palmer's longtime friend, Peter Kerr, an itinerant preacher in Ontario, and had scheduled Kerr to speak at camp in August. When Kerr was unable to, the Canfields asked Palmer to cover for him. That week, Palmer

met Pastor Hugh Morrison, pastor of CNBC's Margaree Valley Baptist Church in Cape Breton.

Two years later, Morrison asked Palmer to move to Cape Breton and plant a church—Margaree Valley's third church plant—in Inverness. Palmer said no.

"I felt in my spirit it was the right thing but my daughter said no," said Palmer, who added a concern of his own. "It's going from a church I'd been with for 20 years, and you just don't want to jump ship." Further, the Palmers were concerned about finances.

Unable to find a job anywhere in Canada, and scraping the bottom of their financial barrel, the Palmers family moved in with his mother near Picton, Ontario. "Mom went to a Baptist church [Napanee Baptist] so we went to church with her," Palmer said. "The pastor, John Stewart, had come from the same [Plymouth Brethren] church tradition I had. He got into ministry after teaching school, and his first post was as a church planter in northern Alberta.



"Pastor John, his wife Christy and the whole church became such an encouragement to us," Palmer continued. "John said we needed to go to Cape Breton."

When Morrison called to repeat his interest in Palmer starting the Inverness church, Palmer said yes. That was January 2015. But three days before they were to leave for Cape Breton, Palmer got a call from Goodyear, offering him a local \$150,000 a year job. He wrestled with the idea for several hours.

"I believe that was a test from God," Palmer said. "Now we're here by conviction. We launched the church in the fall of 2015 with 19 people and now have 30. The Lord is doing things; we're growing."

About 135,000 people live on Cape Breton, a mostly rural island peppered with small towns and fishing villages. About 1,400 live in Inverness, a seaside village.

"It's stunningly beautiful here," Palmer said. "It's a rugged mountainous region with the sea all around us. We're two hours from a large city, and have to drive at least an hour to find a town big enough to have a clothing store.

"It's a very slow pace of life," the church planter continued. "Everybody knows everybody. But less than one percent attend church here. Pakistan has more evangelicals than we do, as a percentage of the population."

A desire for theological education led Palmer to the Canadian Southern Baptist Seminary, where his first class was a five-day, on-campus, intensive study last January on Theology of Worship.

"I was a bit skeptical about it ... but it was the best thing I've ever studied. It was incredibly rich and Christ-centred," Palmer said. "I learned so much, such as how to organize a service in such a way we do not break the spirit of worship. Another was the whole discussion around giving. The professor pointed out if we don't teach the Lord's people about giving as part of worship we're failing to teach them all that worship entails and we're also denying them the blessing of giving in worship; that's so true."

In one takeaway from the class, Palmer now leads Inverness Community Church to "stand when we read the Bible out of reverence and respect for the Word of God," the church planter said. "The class was really Christ-honouring, so biblical. Life is worship. Worship is far more than singing five songs on Sunday morning. It was such a rich course for me. It removed my skepticism."

This semester Palmer is taking two three-credit courses online: New Testament Survey 1 and Old Testament Survey 1.

"The online format works for me," Palmer said. "With the demands of ministry, we get study done when it's convenient. As long as I get through everything checked off by the end of the week it's all good."

Easy Ways Your Church Can Partner with a Local Church Plant

Sometimes we overcomplicate what it means to partner with a church plant. Partnering looks like whatever you and the church plant agree it will look like! If you are new, it might help to begin close to home. So, whether you are brand new to the idea of partnering or your church just needs a few new ideas, here are some easy ways that your church can partner with a local church plant:

PRAY – Prayer is the foundation of everything we do.

- ✓ **Include a photo of a church planter family in your scrolling announcements.** Each week have one slide with a specific prayer request, and if possible, a second slide with “praise God” for an answered prayer request or celebration point (i.e. baptism, successful outreach, etc.).
- ✓ **Include specific prayer requests of church planters in natural prayer times** such as weekly worship gatherings, prayer meetings, Sunday School, or small group prayer times.
- ✓ **Meet the planter** – Invite the church planter family to join your church (or even a small group gathering) so that individuals can get to know them and so that they can share specific prayer requests in person.
- ✓ **Have a church planter record a video** asking for a specific prayer request. He may stand in a field where an event will happen and ask your church to pray.

PARTICIPATE – Nothing develops a heart for a ministry more than stepping foot in the community. But it doesn’t need to be a weeklong mission trip.

- ✓ **Rotating volunteers** – Ask for volunteers in your church to help with a church plant’s child care needs. If ten people volunteer five Sundays per year each (less than once every two months), your church could supply one

extra children’s volunteer for a church plant for an entire year. This may sound small, but it could be huge!

- ✓ **Specific event** – Sometimes a church plant’s greatest need is to have five extra people to help with a one-time event. Having extra people to run the hot dog stand or bouncy castle will mean that the church plant’s leaders will be able to better connect and have conversations with those from the community who are attending.

PROVIDE – There are many ways that your church can help meet practical needs.

- ✓ **One-time project** – Find out about a special project or need a church plant has in the coming season and help collect for that. If a plant is planning to give away backpacks to school children, your church could help fill them. If a plant is planning to give away Bibles as part of a summer outreach, your children’s Sunday school classes could collect bottles or do some other small fundraiser to see how many Bibles just the children’s classes could buy.
- ✓ **Provide for small recurring bill** – Every church plant can use monthly support, no matter how small. One church planter was relieved that for years, a supporting church had given around \$100 a month to cover his cell phone bill. This could apply to a monthly transit pass, internet bill, or even a \$25 Tim Hortons gift card. There may be a church member who is willing to give to a specific tangible need like this.

Already connected with a church planter? Then you are good to go! I hope that these tips can help your church expand how you practically support your church plant partner.

In addition to a heavy reading load, sometimes there are pre-recorded lectures students can view at their own pace, and online discussions professors participate in. Students who send in questions get responses usually the same day, Palmer said.

“Another benefit of the seminary is that the professors are keen on praying for you and your ministry,” the church planter continued. “Once they sent me a letter in the mail

signed by the professors who had been praying for me. Occasionally I meet professors who say ‘Oh you’re Mark Palmer; I’ve been praying for you!’

“I wish more students would take advantage of the [Canadian Southern Baptist Seminary](#),” Palmer said; “They’re family-oriented and just beautiful people. You feel like you’re a big family. I’m learning tons of stuff and I find it very relevant and practical to my ministry.”

uVillage Korean church has first baptism

VANCOUVER—With a heart for the next generation, it has been six years already since my family came to live in and do ministry with Origin Church on the UBC campus with Craig O'Brien and his family. Sunday worship gatherings, one-on-one meetings and discipleship with students, Alpha group, a Thanksgiving gathering, inner-city ministry, exam care packages, and a Christmas gathering ... The fall term passed by quickly and 65 to 85 people gather each Sunday to worship together at Origin.

Since 2015, Origin has been praying for effective Gospel ministry in the Chinese and Korean communities, the largest ethnic groups on the UBC campus. With limited resources, we thought it would be an answer to prayer when God sent team workers for ministry. God sent Ian Lee and Jaeho Huh for the Korean ministry, two people with hearts for the next generation. Together we could start uVillage Korean Church. Finding a place to worship is a big challenge at UBC but God answered our prayers and opened doors for us to rent the Chapel of the Epiphany (Vancouver School of Theology) at a reasonable rate.

uVillage had its first Sunday gathering in October with many churches assisting in love. One church volunteered to be a financial hub, another church helped us purchase equipment, another paid for uVillage T-shirts, and another paid our first month's rent. We are full of gratitude.

As of last week, 10 to 12 adults gather for worship and 6 children attend uVillage Kids. We had our first family retreat in late December. We are most grateful for our first baptism on January 1, of a first-year engineering student named Jeff Yoon.

Love and prayers are desperately needed for the campus church ministry that focuses on reaching out to the young people with the Gospel, and equipping them to be followers of Jesus. I know that God has called our family to the UBC campus. Please pray for our family so that we can continue to live and work well as church planters.

Please keep Origin Church at UBC and uVillage Church (www.uvillage.ca) in your hearts and prayers and be our partners in this work.

Romans 6:23 states "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord."

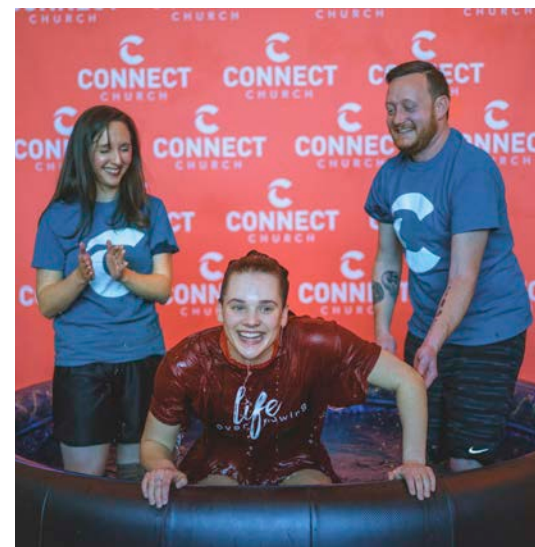
Wages is how you pay for things because of the work you have done to receive the money. Death occurs because of the action of sin. Sin comes in all shapes and forms and is often disguised. New Arabic church plant making a difference in Calgary

CALGARY, AB—If passersby at Calgary's two train stations receive a bouquet of sunflowers with a chocolate tied to a "Jesus loves you" note, Maher Said is likely responsible.

The church planter and pastor of Grace Arabic Church in Calgary, Alberta is constantly looking for ways to reach the community for Christ.

"We are new, yes," Said commented. "But we have a vision; we have a goal to reach out to the community three times this year. Already, this Valentine's day, my church members and I wanted to share Jesus' love in a creative way—in a way that was pretty and printed, wrapped and full of love."

Grace Arabic Church, which officially launched January 14, 2017, saw 150 attendees at their first worship service.

"It appears there is a great need for Arabic churches in Canada," Said noted. "I had no idea. God called me to do this, to plant an Arabic church, through my sister. One day, she called me and said, 'I think God needs to use you as a church planter.'"

Said was not surprised by his sister's comment.

"She prays for me often," Said added. "I just said, 'What? Well, we will see.'"

But after one month of fasting and praying, Said knew. God was going to use him to plant an Arabic church in Calgary. Said

took the church planter's assessment through the North American Mission Board and passed. Grace Arabic Church was set in motion; their first service was held at their Sending church, Richmond Hill Baptist Church, entirely in Arabic with headsets for attendees who needed English translation.

"We currently serve families and singles," Said commented. "They're of all ages, really. Most of the families found us through printed flyers and invitations that we handed out. Some of the families are believers already, and others are God's gift to us—the nonbelievers we can witness to. We've got a balance of believers and nonbelievers to share His message in our church. It's amazing."

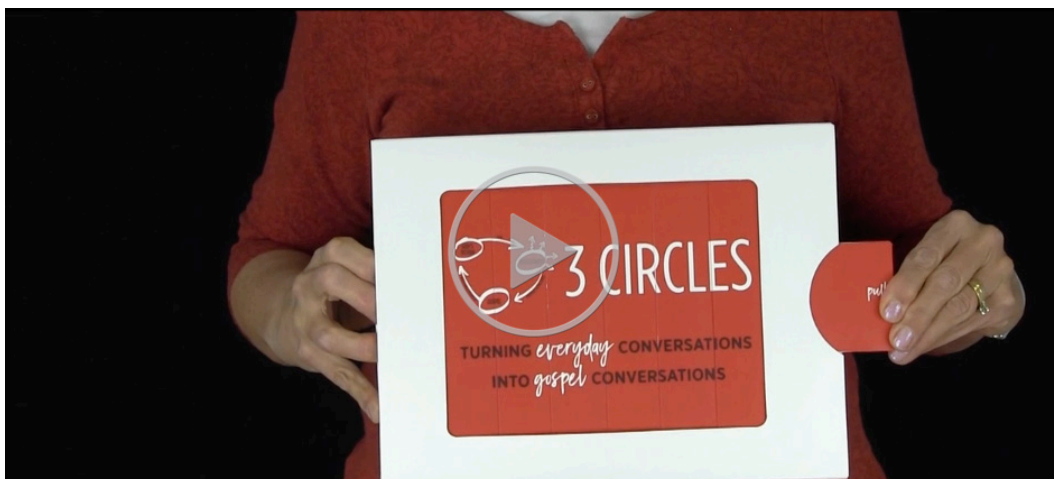

Grace Arabic Church has set Bible studies at Richmond Hill Baptist Church on alternating Fridays. However, Said plans to do more.

“For the nonbelievers, we want a group, too,” added Said. “We plan to make this other group on Wednesdays as well. They need their own because they are beginners. I plan to make that happen for them.”

Grace Arabic Church was planted with a vision from Said to “make the church a place for learning and retreat.”

“I’d like to make some counselling and consulting services available in our church,” Said mentioned, noting that his online search for Calgary or Alberta counselling services had rendered him speechless. “The prices counsellors were quoting people for help they needed was too much. Instantly I knew this was where I was supposed to be because I have a Master’s in Counselling—so do three of my church members. We knew God had brought us here, together, to add this valuable service to the community through our church for free. That’s the dream for this year and a big challenge for me!”

Kingdom Seeds

Multiplying Church Centres are increasing the pace of church planting in the CNBC

A term used among our catalysts and church planters is MCC. It stands for Multiplying Church Centre. The definition of an MCC is a local church that is multiplying itself by planting additional churches in a planned and systematic way.

One example of a church that is a Multiplying Church Centre is La Chapelle Rosemont, led by David Pothier. Planted in 2013, they have grown until they worship in two services with a combined attendance that exceeds 1,000. David began to train the leader of their first daughter church as soon as La Chapelle Rosemont launched. David Mirck was trained and sent out with a team to plant La Chapelle Mile End in 2015. The next daughter church, led by Jackson Ntumba, will launch in April 2018. Their third daughter church, led by Josiah Laporte, will launch in 2020.

In each case, the lead planter and their team are “insiders.” All were disciplined, recruited, and trained for leadership by

the staff of La Chapelle Rosemont. David has a very particular process that enables his church to grow leaders in character as well as in skill and perspective. Each leader begins by serving in the setup/takedown of the church on Sunday. They are trained in practical ministry and theology. The end result is a leader who is both high character and high competency, able to launch and grow a significant church in the urban areas of Quebec.

La Chapelle is not alone in this intentional process of multiplication. The CNBC has churches using an MCC process in every large city of Canada. Their commitment to extend God’s Kingdom through church multiplication is critical to achieving our goal of 1,000 churches by 2020. among hard core biker organizations as being “one of them.” Several current bikers have indicated their interest in switching colours and becoming part of his Christian-based biker club.

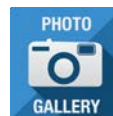

Nepalese pastor shares testimony of salvation at ordination

On Sunday January 29, Gary Smith and I attended the ordination for Pastor Nar Sarki at Nepalese Baptist Church in Lethbridge, Alberta.

The service began with the ordination questions. All of those who have been ordained can relate to how nerve-racking that time can be. Pastor Nar has only been in Canada for two years so the language barrier was a hurdle to overcome. Little did we know that this young man from Nepal would surprise us with his testimony, his knowledge of the Bible and his passion for God's Word.

The part I will never forget was when he explained how his father was dying in Nepal and out of desperation, even though they were Hindu, Nar told his father that his only chance of living was if he put his faith in Jesus. He went on to tell his father he had heard that in another town those who trusted in Jesus were healed from their sickness.

His father asked, "How do I do this?" Nar went on to tell him that people say that if one prays and asks for forgiveness and believe in Jesus they will be healed and have eternal life. His father prayed and weeks later was healed of his terminal sickness.

Now I know that we don't often get to see this or hear stories like this in North America but this is missions; God works in different ways all over the world. In some places, like the Middle East, people dream of Jesus for days to the point of asking missionaries, "Who is this Jesus we are dreaming about?"

A week later Nar's father told him, "Son, why are you still a Hindu? You've asked me to pray to Jesus and you haven't done it yourself after we've seen His power."

"On that day, I gave my life to Christ," Nar told us. Then an Indian pastor began to train him and went on to share the Gospel with people in town.

Now, five years later, Nar is a pastor for his church in Lethbridge, reaching his people from Nepal who are here living and working in Alberta. He has a wife and two children. They offer their home to feed people and develop relationships on a weekly basis. His passion is to win over all his people in Alberta, Canada and the world and continue to grow his Nepalese church that already has fifty people.

Gary and I saw many wonderful things in that church but we will never forget the joy and humility of Pastor Nar's family, the warmth of the Nepalese church, the passionate way they worship and the reminder of the power of the Gospel that saves people all over the world every day.

This is a reminder that here in Canada we have the world around us. Here, we can preach the Gospel to all people—those from other countries as well as Canadians. It is a reminder that missions begins here, as soon as we walk out of our homes and churches. May God help us be true witnesses of Jesus Christ, reaching all nationalities here and to the ends of the earth because our heavenly Father gave us the power to fulfill our mission that is not optional. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Pastor Roy and Weida were sponsored by their home church, Cambrian Heights Baptist Church in Calgary and by the Canadian National Baptist Convention's [grant](#) for ministers and their spouses. The Spannagels said it was a dream come true to be on mission with their children and grandchildren.

One of their main mission outreaches was to minister to and encourage the fifty-plus missionary units in the Dakar area. Cambrian Heights Baptist Church provided funds for a Christmas dinner party and gift bags for all present. "It was a fun evening as everyone ate Lebanese food and sang Christmas carols in Shad's backyard around a totally unnecessary blazing fire pit," says Weida. However, the hot chocolate and fire was a special treat for the children present.

Another ministry opportunity for Weida was to interact with the Deaf community. There are two families ministering to the deaf in Dakar. Each family has at least one hearing-impaired member which allows all family members to help reach others in that special community.

Home visits into the Muslim community were also a highlight for both Roy and Weida. They visited with Dabou and his family in their two-room apartment that had no kitchen or washroom. The kitchen is a fire pit outside and the washroom is a shared room with six other families. While there, Roy and Weida interacted with 18 family members including seven children. They were able to see the reality of poverty and lostness as they shared through three language interpretations. The family was so appreciative of their prayers for them. Prayers were voiced that God would open their eyes and enlighten their hearts and minds to know the one true God.

All the Spannagel/Hall children attend school at the Dakar Baptist Academy. The Spannagels spent several days and evenings attending sports events, concerts and Christmas programs. Roy had the unique opportunity to share his testimony with the students at chapel. (There are many students from Muslim/Animistic backgrounds.) All the students thought Roy was "pretty cool for an old guy."

Another special treat was for the whole family to travel a couple of hours south of Dakar to a beach area where they spent a few days together. They played in the water, went for walks on the beach, played games, ate lots of food and celebrated Hailey's eighth birthday. Many of you prayed for Hailey's birth and physical condition; she's doing fine now with no lasting effects.

"It was a great three plus weeks of ministry/fellowship with other missionaries and a wonderful reunion with our family," said Roy and Weida.

Was it easy? No, travel time was 24 hours each way. Enduring different climates, language barriers and totally opposite cultures took its toll on all.

Was it worth it? Absolutely! The joy seen on a face as time was taken to smile and share a friendly handshake or hug that said, "I care," or a thank you for just being there was worth it all.

Can you go on mission? Most assuredly. This was the sixteenth mission opportunity for the Spannagels during their 51 years of ministry. If they can go, so can you.
